All personnel shall take all practical steps to ensure that no action or interaction on their part harms any other person (incl. themselves).

GUIDELINES CREW SHOULD FOLLOW AROUND LIGHTING EQUIPMENT

- 1. The Photographer or the Photographic Assistant is in charge of all lighting equipment. Please consult them before plugging any cable into distribution boards or sockets.
- 2. Do not place food or drinks on any electrical appliance or fitting.
- 3. Do not stand, walk or drive over cables.
- 4. Non-lighting crew keep clear of electrical equipment. Do not attempt to turn on any lights.

BASIC SAFETY GUIDELINES FOR LIGHTING

- 1. All cables should be laid with public safety in mind and should be laid in troughs or covered in high traffic (pedestrian or vehicular) areas.
- 2. All lighting fixtures or stands should be adequately supported or mounted to prevent tipping or falling.
- 3. Hung fixtures should have a safety rope or chain to prevent falling.
- 4. Any opened face unit should have protection, where practicable, to guard against shrapnel from exploding bulbs/lamps.
- 5. All electrical equipment should be covered if being used near water.
- 6. Use Residual-current device (RCD) or similar protection when practicable or required by legislation.
- 7. Appropriate fire extinguisher on set and standing by.
- 8. All crew, cast & client must avoid looking directly into lights at all times when on set.

BASIC SAFETY GUIDELINES FOR ALL CREW TO FOLLOW

- 1. Ensure that Health and Safety policies/ induction of the client organisation are known, and that all crew are aware of them.
- 2. Remain mindful of traffic do not step into road without ensuring safety. If any crew member is on or near roads, they must wear hi-visabilty vest.
- 3. All vehicles parked on roads to be coned off when on location.
- 4. Film Crew signs to be posted if filming on road or footpath.
- 5. Be aware of all overhead power lines. There is a minimum clearance of 4 meters for overhead power conductors.
- 6. No digging is to be done without checking with local power company, phone company or gas company.
- 7. Appropriate clothing to be worn at all times.
- 8. All incidents and near misses must be reported to safety and/or production.
- 9. Slip, slap, slop and wrap! Be mindful of the sun and ensure proper protection is used.
